

City of Seaside Transportation System Plan

The City of Seaside is beginning a long-range planning process to determine transportation improvements needed to address current and future needs of residents, businesses, and visitors. This work is being done in coordination with the Oregon Department of Transportation, Clatsop County, and the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development. This effort began in March, 2008 and is expected to continue through February, 2009.

The planning efforts will result in a Transportation System Plan, or TSP, for Seaside. The TSP will describe how the transportation network in Seaside is being used now (2008), and how it is expected to be used in the future (2030). The planning team, through coordination with stakeholders and the public, will develop a plan for improvements to all modes of transportation in Seaside – the road network (both local roads and the state highway [US 101]), the bicycle and pedestrian network, the transit network, the rail network, and the airport. Several options will be developed and discussed with the community (as described below).

A draft TSP will be made available to the public for comment in late 2008. The revised TSP will be presented to the City of Seaside for anticipated adoption by City Council. It will include a project list for incorporation into city, county, and state Transportation Improvement Programs, and will match potential funding sources to the identified improvement projects.

The project area is located within the Seaside city limits and the Urban Growth Boundary. The map below shows the Seaside City Limits.
